Around the Word Devotions + the week of July 14-20, 2024

THEME OF THE WEEK: Submission to the Lord of Compassion

Our Lord's compassion spills off the pages of the gospel accounts. He feeds the hungry, He heals the sick, He raises the dead, and most importantly He forgives the sins of sinners. This week's readings recall and remind us of our Lord's loving compassion and mercy for us in times of need, trial, temptation and suffering. We need not fear, for the Lord is faithful, He keeps His promises. He who made us His beloved children in Christ Jesus will see us through all things.

SCRIPTURE: Mark 8:1-9 The Lord's Saving Compassion for You

This is the second miraculous feeding recorded by Saint Mark. In both instances, our Lord's compassion moves Him to feed these very large, concert size, crowds of hungry people with "a few small fish" and some loaves of bread (v. 7). These miraculous feedings point us to Jesus' true identity as the "Son of God." the "Holy One of God" Who has come to give God's people much more than a free lunch (Mk. 1:1; 2:24)! Why does Saint Mark include this second miraculous feeding? These four thousand people are predominantly Gentiles who are to be included in all that Jesus has come to do and give for the life and salvation of the world. Thank You Lord Jesus, for extending the saving love and compassion

of Your cross to me. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:49-56 Delighting in the Word of the LORD

In what do you delight? Many God-given first article gifts bring us joy and delight; friends and family, rest and recreation, vocations and vacations. These are good things. The Psalter teaches us that God's Torah, His Word of law and gospel is our ultimate joy and delight. Those who delight in the LORD's Word and ways have light, life, joy, peace, comfort and hope. Because of this, the Psalmist can say, "How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!...Your testimonies are my heritage forever, for they are the joy of my heart" (Ps. 119:103; 111). Blessed are those who delight in the LORD's Word,

His commands and His promises. May Your Word. O LORD, be my delight.

my joy and my song now and forever. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Romans 6:19-23 The Free Gift of God's Righteousness in Christ

Saint Paul realizes that the human illustration of slavery has its limitations, but is nevertheless an apt way of describing the human condition. No one is absolutely free! One is either a slave to sin and death or a slave to God and righteousness. Slaves to sin die, for the wages of sin is death, Slaves to God, united and bound to Christ Jesus in the waters of Holy Baptism, live in the righteous ness He has freely bestowed on them. Baptized into Christ, we are dead to sin, free from its tyranny, and the condemnation of the law. Baptized into Christ, we are raised with Christ to live anew that by daily contrition and repentance we might die to sin and live before God in righteousness. O Lord, thank You for the free gift of life and salvation in Christ Jesus. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Jeremiah 31:23-25 The LORD Does Not Forget His People

It's a painful and heartbreaking thing to be forgotten by friends or family. How infinitely worse to feel forsaken or forgotten by God! Languishing in exile, ancient Israel was sure that the LORD had not only forgotten about them but had cast them off forever. Thus, "the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel" declares to His people that He has not forgotten them, but will restore them, bring them out of exile, bless them and make them His righteous people once again (v. 23). He will ultimately forsake His one and only Son for them and for you so that they and you might never be forsaken or forgotten by Him. This is comfort that satisfies the weariest of souls! To You, O LORD, be all praise and glory.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 10:24-31 You are of Much Value to God

Do you ever wonder about your worth in life? Do you ever compare your worth with the material things you own, your value with the skills, the physical or intellectual gifts you have or do not have? If you do, you are certainly not alone. Our Lord Jesus, however, would have us meditate His Words here in Matthew chapter ten and upon our incalculable worth and value to Him and our Heavenly Father. Not only are you of more value than many sparrows, but every hair on your head is known to Him who calls you His own. The Father did not spare His own Son, but gave Him up in death for you so that you might be His

beloved child. This is your value and your worth. Thank You, O Lord, for making me Your beloved child in Christ Jesus. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Acts 14:8-23 Struck Down, but Not Destroyed

Time and time again Saint Paul experiences and endures much suffering for faithfully proclaiming the "good news" of Jesus. And yet, he is "not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes" (Rom. 1:16). Paul is nearly stoned to death, and yet he gets back up and continues to do the work God has given him to do. No, Paul is no fictional superhero, but a man who finds his strength in the cross of Jesus and the grace of God that is sufficient for him in suffering and weakness (2 Cor. 12:8-10). Thus, Paul can say, "We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed" (2 Cor. 4:8-9). O Lord, help me cling to the cross of Jesus and Your all sufficient grace. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 125 The LORD Surrounds His People

Saint Paul bids us to be wise and walk carefully for "the days are evil" (Eph. 5:16). Dark are the days we are living in and evil surrounds us on all sides. Therefore, we are prudent to put on "the whole armor of God" that we may stand against the schemes of the devil (Eph. 6:11). Psalm 125 reminds us that the rule of the wicked will not prevail over the land of the righteous (v. 3) and that Yahweh surrounds His people as the mountains surround Jerusalem (v. 2). Like Jerusalem, we are safe, treasured, and protected. One day, the wicked will indeed be judged and punished. Until then, "those who trust in the LORD are like Mount Zion, which cannot be moved, but abides forever" (v. 1). Help me, O LORD, to walk carefully in Your ways, trusting in You, Amen.
